**Observatory Director: Gerry Samolyk** reported that ice damage to "A" Dome was repaired. The furnace is not running, and may require a new filter. The "B" Dome limit switch has been sticking due to cold weather. We tabled the talk of purchasing a snow blower this year and have decided to pay to have the lot plowed each time it snows.

Light Pollution: Brian Ganiere talked with New Berlin city engineer. He said he said there is no current activity in Westridge Development, but there are plans for a new golf driving range. Suggestions were made to have members who are New Berlin residents to write to city Planning Commission, and to have members of all communities watch their local papers for lighting issues.

Wanda Berner said that her company, Miller Bros. Heating and Air Conditioning, has donated about \$500 and a lot of time to keep our furnace running and we should replace it. A "scratch and dent" Lennox 100,000 BTU furnace (LP or natural gas) is available for \$1,304, with full warranty. (purchased by unanimous vote) **Dan Koehler** will explore costs for natural gas line to east wall of A building.
