

MAS Summer Campout

The Milwaukee Astronomical Society will once again sponsor a summer campout at the Yanko Farm in Rib Lake Wisconsin the weekend of August 6 & 7, 2010.

"We have had many campouts in the past and we always had fun times." says Dan Yanko. "There are very dark skies where you can see the Milky Way touch the tree lines to the North and South on a clear night."

The Yanko farm offers a variety of options to make this a great camping and observing experience. You can camp in the yard, use the fireplace in the garage, grill out, cook your meals in the kitchen, use the refrigerator, use the bathroom or just relax in the house. All the comforts of home are available. There is electric-

ity to power your telescopes or camper if needed.

During the day you can go fishing in Wood or Spirit Lake, bike on the Pine Line Trail, hike on the Ice Age trail, visit Tim's Hill which is the highest point in Wisconsin, visit Gertsberger Pines, drive on the ATV trails, visit the historical museum in Medford, visit Concrete Park in Phillips or just hike on the 40 acres of the Yanko Farm. There are plenty of restaurants close by also.

If camping is not in the stars for you, Rib Lake has two hotels to choose from. They are Camp 28 Bar/Restaurant/Motel phone #715-427-2828 (Rooms \$60 to \$67 a night) and the R Corner Store Rustic Inn phone #715-427-3270 (\$45 to \$65 a night).

The camping and tele-



scope observing is free to members of the MAS. If you do not have a telescope you can still enjoy views from other member's scopes. We would be happy to give you a tour of the night sky.

Rib Lake is about 200 miles from Milwaukee and it is an easy four hour drive with two rest stops. There are four lane highways most of the journey.

Volunteers Needed – Upcoming Elections


Directions
