The MAS fall campout will be at the Yanko Farm in Rib Lake Wisconsin, September 26th through the 28th.



Now that the summer is over, that means its prime time for astronomy again! We have a number of events over the next few weeks. So for those of us who have spent the summer checking off items on the "Honey-do" list, now it time to start cashing in on those earned SPU's*

Friday September 12: (9) Metis asteroid occultation. Time: 1:41AM. This is a major astronomical event for Wisconsin residents. Many members of the MAS are planning on observing this easily observable event and send their findings to IOTA (International Occultation Timing Association). Friday September 19: Monthly Membership Meeting 8:00 PM @ the MAS Observatory. Join your fellow members for a night of MAS business, information and socializing.

Friday September 26-28: Annual observing campout at the Yanko farm in Rib Lake Wisconsin. MAS member Dan Yanko opens his getaway home for a weekend of REAL DARK SKY observing. To give you an idea of how dark this sight is, in 2005 I was able to easily see the Horsehead Nebula in my 6 inch reflector! Of course the highlight of the night was being serviced hot coffee and chocolate at 2AM by Dan himself... we still give him a hard time about that! If you are looking for a fun getaway weekend this is great event!

Also, remember that the observatory is still open any Saturday nights for our members. Multiple visual scopes and CCD imagers are available for use.

In 1609 Galileo Galilei built two telescopes that could magnify object 3 and twenty times respectively. With those two telescopes, he was able to observe the Moon, the satellites of Jupiter, a supernova, confirm the phases of Venus and discovered sunspots.

To commemorate this event 2009 has been designated as the International Year of Astronomy (IYA). This will be a International celebration with participation by both professional and amateur astronomers. The main goal of the celebration is to promote astronomy and continue to introduce the general public to astronomy.

Two projects are under development. The first one is the coordination of observations of the Epsilon Aurigae eclipse. This eclipse occurs once every 27 years and lasts for almost 2 years. Since it occurs during the IYA, and is easy to observe, it is major project for amateur and professional astronomers.

The second project is to give as many people as possible the opportunity to look through a quality telescope. Naturally amateur astronomy organizations can easily fulfill this goal. The aim is to give 10 million people chance to look through a telescope in 2009. Sound impossible... then work the numbers 100,000 amateur astronomers each give 100 people a chance to view the sky and the number is achievable.
